Running the Race

I write this article with mixed emotions. I reflect back on my life and the baptism I received at St. Elmo Methodist Church. It was at the time of transition in the merging of the Methodist Church and the Evangelical United Brethren. I don't remember those days as I was too young, but do have fond memories of visiting St. Elmo with my grandmother. I have vivid memories growing up United Methodist at White Oak. My work in United Methodist camping and my time at the United Methodist Wesley Foundation at Tennessee Tech were both times of ministry that help me discern my call to full-time ministry. Just as Bobbie and I were starting our family and looking at moving our church home to Ringgold, GA, I heard the call to stay at White Oak and serve the youth there. That became a time of great transformation as I also during that time began online studies in seminary. And I reflect back on 12 years of full-time ministry in Holston Conference, and realize these have all been good years.

During a Called Special Session of the Holston Annual Conference on April 22, Spring City's decision to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church was ratified, and I surrendered my United Methodist credentials all to become effective May 29. I'm not going to mince words here: this has been the most difficult season of my life as I have sought to discern and walk by faith. I know the same is true for each one of you, my beloved. Yet I am excited for our future in a new expression of the Wesleyan movement. God has great plans for us if we will listen and follow God in faith. It is a joy to serve as your pastor, and I look forward to what God is going to do in us and through us in the coming vears.

I know that some of you are happy, some are neutral, and some of you are hurting. For those of you who are hurting, yes, I do hurt with you. I want to address some of that concern and offer

the love of Jesus Christ as a balm for the hurt. I need to also provide what you can expect in this month of May, and the expectations of membership in the future.

As the Annual Conference met to worship and share communion together, we acknowledged during communion that "Although we will part from this table on different paths, we all arrive here and will leave here as God's beloved children." This annual conference was about love, grace, and blessing, and for that I am Ephesians 4:4-6 grateful for the way the Holston Conference and Bishop Wallace-Padgett handled everything. We go forward with no animosity, but with the holy love of Jesus Christ for those choosing new paths forward and for those remaining United Methodist.

In the coming weeks, you will notice changes in our church as we begin replacing signs and using our new name Spring City Methodist Church. We will also have a new website and email addresses. We will post on our Facebook page, in the bulletins, and coming newsletter what those will be when they are active.

On Monday, May 29, Spring City Methodist Church will officially become a part of the Global Methodist Church. On that same day I will become an ordained elder in the Global Methodist Church and each of Spring City's professing members will become members of the Global Methodist Church. Those on the baptized roll will remain on the baptized roll. On Sunday, June 4, we will worship with a Weslevan Covenant renewal service and have time to remember our baptisms and membership vows, and celebrate Holy Communion.

If you wish to remain a member of the United Methodist Church (UMC), I understand and support your decision. While I am saddened that you may choose to no longer be a part of this church family, I know that you can fulfill your calling to be a disciple of Jesus Christ as a United Methodist, and I want to help you move to the place you feel called. If you know of another UMC that you wish to join, please let me know and I will coordinate with that church's pastor on your transfer. If you do

not yet know of a church, feel free to talk to me about ideas. Another option while you discern is to transfer your membership to the Hiwassee District of the UMC until you make a decision on a local church. If that is your desire, please let me know, and I will get you that transfer form. I pray God's richest blessings in your life and that you experience God's love and grace in a myriad of ways.

As we seek to join God in a journey of bringing new life, reconciliation, and the presence of Christ to all people, and to helping each person reflect the character of Christ (Global Methodist Vision), in the coming months, we will continue looking at how Paul sought to offer Christ to the church in Rome. I encourage you to be present as much as possible as we move forward as a church. We anticipate holding one another accountable to our membership vows to serve God and participate in God's holy Church.

We will be picking up our discussions from our Moving Forward campaign from last fall and will be looking at how we focus our ministry and our outward missions. We will be expecting every member in ministry and mission as we go forward to make disciples of Jesus Christ who worship passionately, love extravagantly, and witness boldly (Global Methodist Mission).

One of the most effective ways to do this is by helping young people form meaningful friendships with their peers. Although the RCHS Best Buddies chapter is just in its second year, more than 120 students have become involved. They communicate with their Buddy weekly and participate in special activities monthly. Buddies have repeatedly expressed the feeling that they have more friends, and peer buddies have a changed perspective on disability. Some have even been motivated to choose Special Education as a career. The group at RCHS is in consideration for Chapter of the Year, which includes clubs in schools around the world. A representative of Best Buddies from Nashville indicated that the involvement displayed by our church would be a positive point for RCHS's chapter in this competition.

Through the years our women's group has provided assistance for the special needs students at the high school, and administrators, teachers, parents, and students are extremely appreciative. Our church is blessed to be able to be involved in such a worthwhile cause!
