Running the Race—November 2023 **Rev. Dave Grant**

As I prepare for our catechism class and as I reflect on our bishops talking about our call to holiness and our need for accountable discipleship, two of our catechetical questions come to mind: What is the beauty of entire sanctification? Should all pursue entire sanctification?

First of all, you may be wondering what is catechesis or what is a catechism. Basically, a catechism is a summary of the principles of Christian religion in the form of questions and answers, used for the instruction of Christians. The Christians being instructed are "catechumens." How's that for your word for the day? This question-and-answer format is been used for centuries, and I'm glad that our church is reclaiming this technique to help us better understand who we are as Christians first, as Methodists second, and as Global Methodists specifically.

So, now what is holiness, or sanctification? It is the "transformation of the human will by the Holy Spirit, so that evil or self-centered motives are displaced and the will conforms to the love of God." In fact John Wesley believed that Christians can be transformed so completely that we would have no known sin in our lives—something Wesley referred to as "entire sanctification" or "Christian perfection." For Wesley, this was the distinctive teaching that God had given Methodists to proclaim.

Once we are justified by the grace of Jesus Christ, we turn from sin, but being free from the power of sin seems so elusive to us. Try as we might, we can't seem to break free from the power sin holds over us with continued faults, failures, even addictions of various kinds. But as we

experience the presence of God in our lives, those parts of our lives that have become destroyed by sin are regenerated, and the love of Christ becomes evident in our lives.

We can't place limits on God's work within us as he conforms our wills into his law of love. So we all cling to the hope and expectation that someday the grace of God will bring us entire sanctification. In fact, in our church today when elders are ordained, they are asked, "Are you going on to perfection?" and "Do you expect to be made perfect in love in this life?" And an affirmative answer is expected.

Will sanctification protect us from ever sinning? No. We will still make mistakes or even unknowingly sin, but sanctification is about us receiving the mind of Christ such that we don't consciously choose to sin.

How do we grow into this sanctification? Through practicing the means of grace, including prayers, presence in church, serving, witnessing, study. Presence in the church would include our community worship, Bible classes, and accountable discipleship groups (that Wesley referred to as "classes" and that we will refer to as A.D. Groups). These are opportunities for check-ins and check-ups as we seek to grow in the grace of Jesus. His grace is free, but we have to open ourselves up to receive it. Number 487 in our hymnal is "Power in the Blood"

> Would you be free from the burden of sin? There's power in the blood, power in the blood. Would you o'er evil a victory win? There's wonderful power in the blood.

Would you open yourself up to receive the wonder-working power in the blood of the Lamb through the Church that He has ordained?
